Sex buying hurts people. And sex buyers perpetuate that harm by putting money in the hands of pimps and traffickers, fueling a predatory practice where vulnerable individuals—usually women and children are sexually exploited for profit. But together we can stop it.

How do we STOP it?



Sexual exploitation and trafficking are complex problems with many factors, but the key driver is the **buyers**. Without them it all stops. That's why countries and cities around the world, including many in the US, are creating policies to prevent people from attempting to buy sex and holding them accountable if they do. It's the surest way to eliminate this inherently harmful industry for good.

In 1999, **SWEDEN** started arresting sex buyers while offering services to prostituted people. The result was a

Many **US CITIES** now require convicted sex buyers to attend classes on the harmful impact of prostitution. Attendees of these classes in San Francisco are

After increasing penalties for sex buyers, NORWAY saw a 5 - 6 0% REDUCTION in street prostitution in Oslo, the country's capital.
